EKC Welcoming Cities Collaborative


The purpose of the WCC is to **support and equip** Eastside cities in furthering their diversity, inclusion, and anti-racism work in alignment with their respective resources, needs, and strengths.

- Develop and establish a regional approach to streamline communication and resources.
- Strengthen our region's ability to accomplish what individual cities can't do alone.
- Support a shift away from traditional community engagement practices that tend to reinforce distrust and perpetuate disenfranchisement.

Welcoming Cities Collaborative


Together with partners and community-based organizations, the Welcoming Cities Collaborative uses a racial equity lens with tools from <u>GARE (Government Alliance on Race and Equity)</u> along with Welcoming America's <u>Welcoming Standard</u> to identify local community-centered priorities.

A mapping process will begin in early 2022, resulting in an East King County directory of initiatives, programs, and services led by and for communities of color. The data will identify our contributions, strengths, and advocacy needs, with a focus on the investments required to advance racial justice, inclusion, and welcoming.
